

According to the principle of territoriality, Belgian citizens residing abroad will, as far as possible, be vaccinated in their country of residence. However, it has been decided that Belgian citizens who are unable to be vaccinated in their country of residence with vaccines approved by the EMA (European Medicines Agency) or according to the current vaccination schedule in Belgium, will be able to be vaccinated in Belgium.

As for the procedure to follow:

1. You are invited to express your interest in being vaccinated in Brussels (at the military hospital of Neder-Over-Hembeek) during a stay in Belgium in the next few months;
2. Belgian citizens of legal age residing in one of the countries listed in the annex and registered in the consular registers of the post, as well as their spouse/partner of foreign nationality or the children of Belgian citizens of legal age who do not have Belgian nationality but live under the same roof, as attested to in the consular registers, are eligible for this operation. These "entitled persons" can pre-register in the same way, via the platform mentioned in point 3;
3. Pre-registration preferably before May 15 (so that the health authorities can evaluate the number of doses to be prepared) in the platform available via the following link: <https://forms.office.com/r/m50WKyN9KX>. Pre-registration will still be possible after May 15;
4. Pre-register only if you have the firm intention to be vaccinated during this stay, for which you communicate the period. If you don't, doses of vaccine may be lost;
5. On the basis of your pre-registration in the above platform, the Consulate will check that you meet the conditions (nationality/registration in the consular registers/18 years old at least) and will transmit to the competent authority for vaccination in the Brussels-Capital Region (the Joint Community Commission - CoCom) your national number and your availability, so as to allow you to register yourself to obtain an appointment in the Bruvax application of the Brussels-Capital Region ;
6. Bruvax will be open for your registration as an overseas resident in the second half of May, which will be confirmed later by email;
7. According to the Taskforce Vaccination, in charge of the organization of the vaccination campaign in Belgium, the actual vaccination for Belgians residing in one of the countries listed in the annex, will be possible from June onwards.
8. Be aware that you will not have a choice of the vaccine you will receive;
9. Plan your stay in Belgium to allow for (i) 7 days of quarantine after your arrival, before you can come to the vaccination center (ii) the time needed for the vaccination period according to the appointments obtained via the Bruvax application (iii) 2 days after the last injection before any departure by plane;
10. Vaccination will be free of charge, and you will be required to identify yourself upon arrival at the Vaccination Center with a valid ID card or passport;
11. Via the pre-registration, your data are collected, in compliance with the rules on the protection of personal data, to enable you to be vaccinated in Belgium against the coronavirus. Before registering your data on the pre-registration platform, you must give your consent for your data to be transmitted to the competent authority for vaccination in the Brussels-Capital Region

and/or to the vaccination center that will be responsible for your vaccination. You can withdraw your consent at any time.

12. Please note that the possibility of being vaccinated in Belgium from June 1 is without prejudice to the conditions of access to the territory, which are constantly evolving in the light of the epidemiological context. So the rules on the granting of visas (for beneficiaries who do not have the Belgian nationality) remain fully applicable.
